The Golden Panthers

- Collecting 393 points on the year, junior **Rodrigo Viegas** is within range of becoming only the 18th Golden Panther player to ever score 400 points in a single season. With **Taurance Johnson** already having scored 424 points this year, the duo would become the first teammates to exceed 400 points in the same season in the 21-year history of the program...
- FIU will tie a school record tonight for the most games played in a single season. Four players on the roster could tie the school record for most games played in a single season. One of those, junior **Fab Fisher**, has not missed a game over his three-year FIU playing career and would be playing the 89th consecutive game as a Golden Panther. With his senior season still remaining, Fisher has set his sights on a pair of FIU ironman records: most consecutive games played (107 by **Anthony Harris**, 1995-99) and most games played (118 by **Dwight Stewart**, 1988-93)...
- The Golden Panthers have showed continuous improvement at the foul line as this season has progressed. In fact, over the last seven games, FIU is shooting 73.5 percent (83 of 113) from the charity stripe...
- With his three steals last Thursday against Arkansas State, freshman **Taurance Johnson** has moved into a ninth-place tie on the school's all-time list with 51 steals on the year.

The Mean Green

- The 14 wins by the Mean Green in head coach **Johnny Jones'** first season ties him for the second-best debut season of an UNT head coach...
- By defeating South Alabama on the road last Saturday, the Mean Green finished with a 14-13 regular-season record--the program's first winning regular season in six years (1995-96)...
- Junior guard **Chris Davis** has become the team's ironman, having started every possible game for the second straight year. He's the only player this season to have started all 27 games.

The Series

- The all-time series is tied at 1-1 with both games decided in overtime. This year, FIU came back from a five-point deficit with 15 seconds remaining to tie the game at 71 at the end of regulation. **Taurance Johnson's** 3-pointer with five seconds left in overtime lifted the Golden Panthers to a 79-78 win in Denton.

Living up to Their Middle Name--

The 13 members of this year's FIU men's basketball roster have representatives from five different countries as well as from five states. The international flair comes from **Carlos Morban** (Dominican Republic), **Slavcho Slavtchev** (Bulgaria), **Rodrigo Viegas** (Brazil) and **Nikola Novakovic** (Yugoslavia). Home grown talent includes **Fab Fisher** and **Chris Carter** (New York), **Haven Jackson**, **Carlos Fernandez** and **Javier Cuenca** (Florida), **Todd Smith** (Georgia), **Mateo Jack** (Washington) and **David Luber** and **Taurance Johnson** (Pennsylvania).

Home Cooking--

Since the Golden Panther Arena opened on Feb. 1, 1986, the FIU's men's basketball program has posted a home-court winning percentage of 59.1 (130-90) compared to its overall winning percentage of 44.9 percent (264-324) over the same period of time.

The Golden Panthers have suffered through only four losing seasons in the 17 they have played in their building. FIU enjoyed another winning season on its home court this year, finishing with an overall 8-5 record.

Exhibitionists--

The Golden Panthers were successful in both of their preseason exhibition games this season with victories over Angola Select, 56-54 (Nov. 2) and the AAU Wheeling Bulldogs, 78-64 (Nov. 8). Freshman **Taurance Johnson** led FIU averaging 15.5 points and eight rebounds over the two games while junior **Nikola Novakovic** put up 13 points in each of the contests.

Dialing Long Distance--

FIU has hit for at least one three-point basket in each of its last 217 games dating back to Jan. 30, 1995. The team record for most treys in a single game is 18, scored at home against Palm Beach Atlantic on Nov. 25, 1995.

Golden Panther opponents, on the other hand, have scored at least one three-point basket in 110 consecutive contests. The last FIU opponent held without a trey was Northern Illinois on Nov. 29, 1998, a 79-55 FIU victory in Miami.

Head Coach **Donnie Marsh** announced that senior **Haven Jackson** and junior **Rodrigo Viegas** are the Golden Panthers team captains for the 2001-02 season.

Donnie Marsh

Donnie Marsh is in his second year as head coach of the Golden Panthers. He is the fourth head coach in the 21-year history of the FIU men's basketball program.

The 45-year old Marsh came to FIU from Virginia Tech where he spent three seasons, the last as that program's associate head coach. Prior to that, Marsh worked as an assistant at Florida State under former Seminoles head coach Pat Kennedy.

After earning All-America honors at Franklin & Marshall College, the Atlanta Hawks selected Marsh in the third round of the 1979 NBA Draft as the 52nd overall selection.

He next worked as associate director of admissions, assistant basketball coach and head baseball coach at his alma mater. For a year, he was also president of Players in Action, Inc., a firm that represents professional athletes.

His basketball head coaching experience began at Division III Elizabethtown (Penn.) College, and from 1989 thru 1993, he was in charge of the Trenton State (NJ) College (now the College of New Jersey) program where he posted a 64-41, four-year record and led the Lions to the 1990 NCAA Division III Championships. Entering this season, Marsh's overall head coaching record stood at 84-75 after six seasons.

Marsh received his bachelor's degree in history and education from Franklin & Marshall in 1979 and continues working toward a master's degree in athletic administration from Florida State.

He and his wife LaRoyce have two children, son Tyler, 13, and daughter Sydnee, 9.

Lightning Rod

Junior transfer **Rodrigo Viegas** has come in and immediately provided team leadership. The Belo Horizonte, Brazil native has had four games with at least 10 rebounds and three double-doubles (points/rebounds). Against North Texas (Jan. 10), he lit up the Mean Green for career highs of 22 points and 14 rebounds. Viegas is one of two Golden Panthers with more than 100 rebounds on the year and earlier this month, become only the 43rd player in FIU history to record more than 300 points in a single season.

Youngster Johnson leads the Way

True freshman **Taurance Johnson** has been the team's top gun. He leads the squad averaging 14.6 ppg and was an honorable mention All-Sun Belt Conference selection. Johnson owns 53 of the team's 80 blocked shots and is currently tied for second on the FIU all-time list, five behind all-time leader Jabahri Brown (1999-2000).

Johnson scored 19 points in his very-first intercollegiate game vs. St. Peter's (Nov. 16), had 20-point performances against Big East Conference opponents Miami (Dec. 3) and West Virginia (Dec. 8) and also against Baylor (Dec. 21) of the Big 12. He scored 23 points on Denver (Jan. 13) and had a career-high 25 points vs. Middle Tennessee (Jan. 5).

He is only one of two FIU freshman to ever to score more than 400 points in a single season with the Golden Panthers record for most points by a first-year player standing at 484 by **Dwight Stewart** during the 1988-89 season.

Leaping Lizards

FIU's 6-foot-2 freshman guard **Carlos Morban**, who last year was the runner-up for Florida's Class 1A Player of the Year, has been measured with a vertical leap of 42 inches. Not only that, but with cat-like quickness, the Dominican Republic native set a new school record with eight steals first against South Alabama (Jan. 27), then against Louisiana Lafayette (Feb. 9). According to NCAA stats through Feb. 125, Morban ranks sixth in Division I with 3.1 steals per game. He leads the Sun Belt Conference in that category and his 86 thefts are the most of any freshman playing major college basketball.

Iron Man Fisher

With 29 consecutive game appearances this season, Golden Panthers junior guard **Fab Fisher** has now played in 88 straight games since first arriving on the FIU campus in 1999. With the remainder of this season and all of next, the school record for most consecutive games played is well within his sights (107 by **Anthony Harris**, 1995-99) as is possibly the record for most games played (118 by **Dwight Stewart**, 1988-93).

Mateo Jack Walks on to FIU Roster--

Head Coach **Donnie Marsh** conducted an open tryout this past fall for members of the university's student body and, from that workout of some 32 FIU students, junior college transfer **Mateo Jack** (Seattle, Wash./Highline CC) was invited to become part of the FIU roster for the 2001-02 season.

The 6-foot-2, 188 pound Jack played two seasons at Highline for head coach **Jeff Albrecht**, last year averaging 10.2 points, 3.2 rebounds and three assists in just over 15 minutes per game.

An all-around athlete, Jack also competed in track and field at Highline, clearing 6-foot-6 in the high jump. He played prep basketball, soccer and ran track while attending Rainier Beach High School and helped the Vikings to a 27-2 record and a Washington state championship in 1998.

The son of Bernda Bacani, Jack is an English major at FIU.

FIU Adds Two Early Signings

Head Coach **Donnie Marsh** announced that junior college guard **Nelson "Junior" Matias** and forward **Eulis Baez**, both of whom play for nationally-recognized Southeastern (Ia.) CC, have signed national letters of intent during the early signing period.

Baez, at 6-feet-7, was mentioned among the Top 30 '02 JC Signings by the *Rick Ball/Ballplayers J.C. Report* in the February edition of Basketball Times. Matias, a 6-foot-2 shooting guard, is coming off injury this season after averaging 12 points, three rebounds and a pair of assists last year.

Both Baez and Matias played along with current Golden Panther **Carlos Morban** with the Dominican Republic junior national team that competed in last summer's Tokyo World Championship Games.

Non-Conference Games

With their final 6-9 record this season against non-conference opponents, the Golden Panthers sport an 8-18 (.308) mark in two years under head coach **Donnie Marsh**. The team was 2-9 last season and since beginning Division I play in 1991-92, the program is 53-70 (.431) versus non-conference foes.

Golden Panthers on the Air

All FIU men's basketball games, home and away, are aired live on Miami's WAXY 790 AM. **Randy Kassewitz** is in his eighth season as the radio voice of the Golden Panthers.
